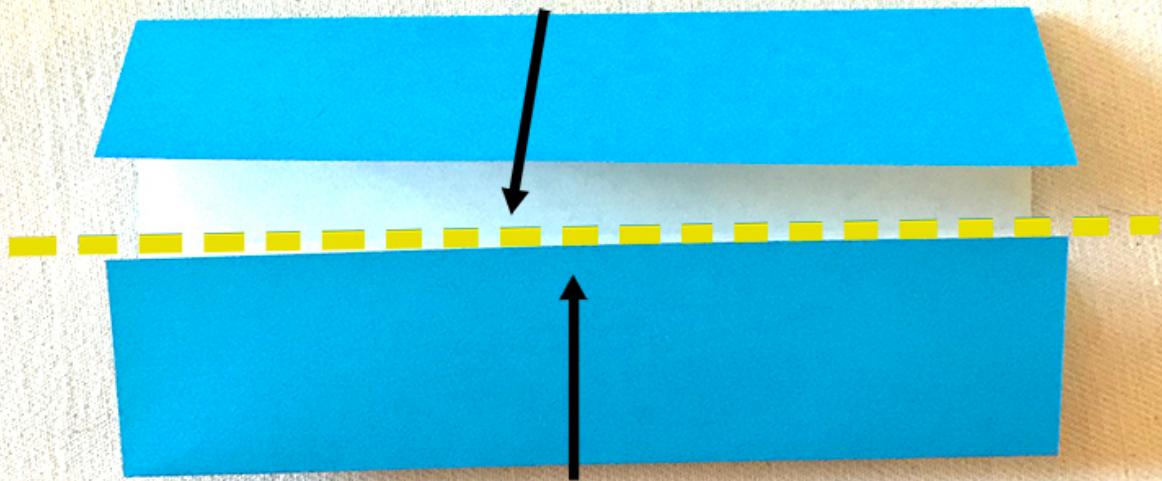
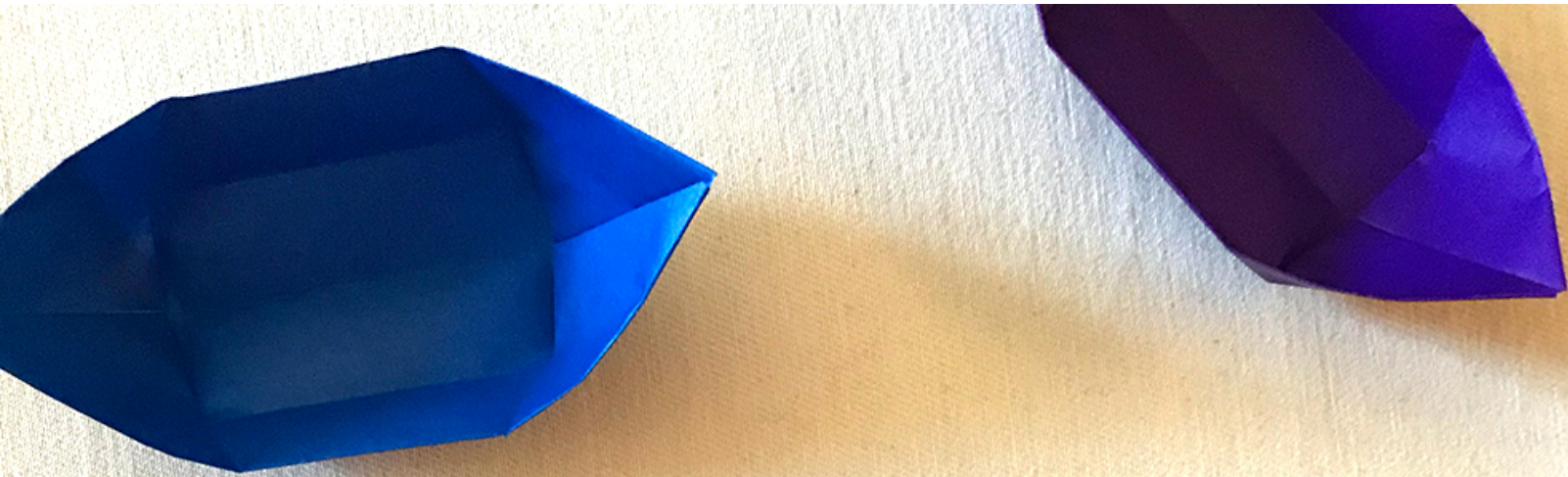
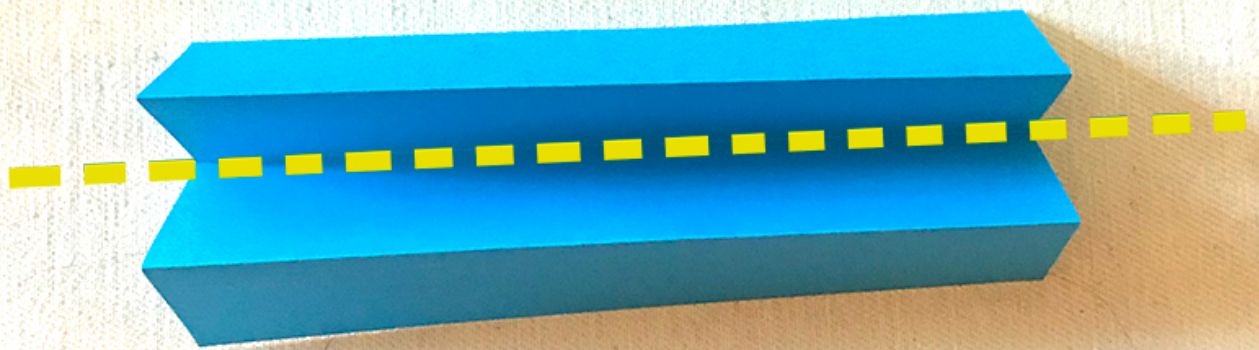
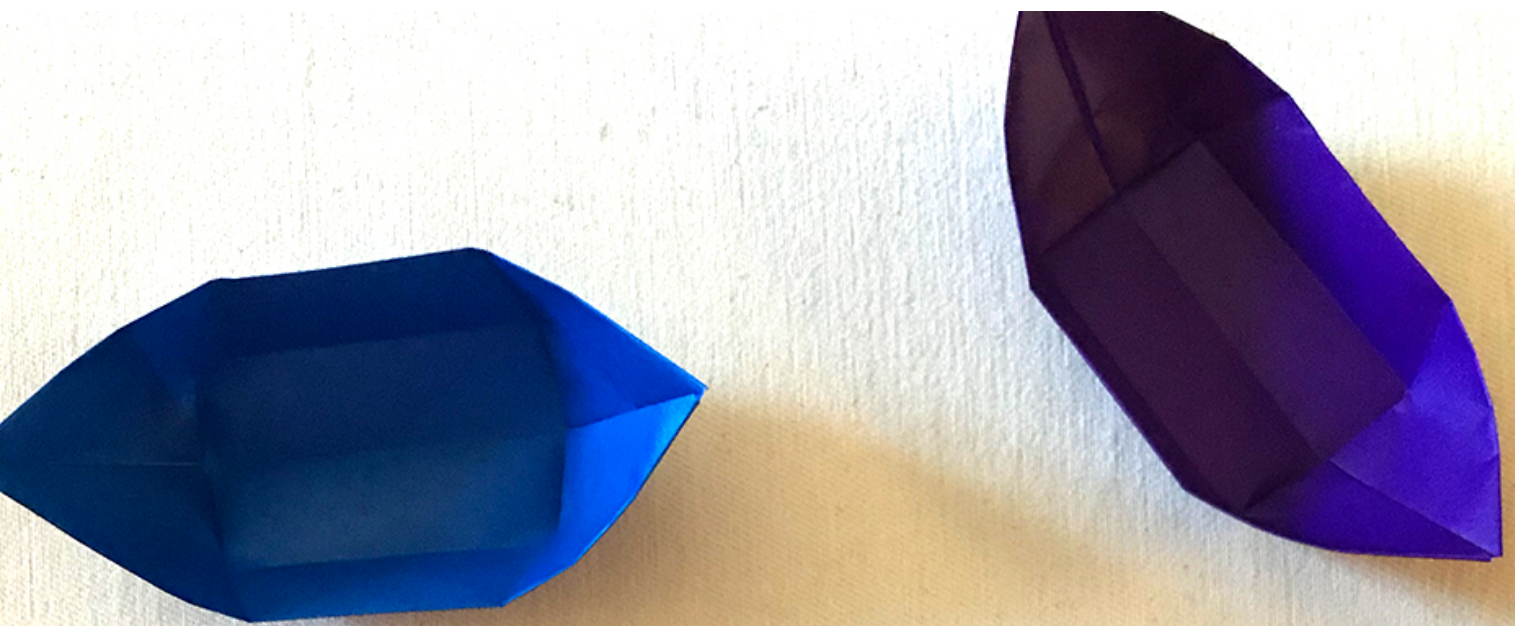


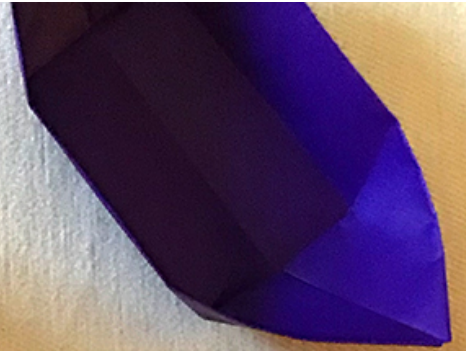
**1. Start with a square of paper; Fold in half along the yellow line**



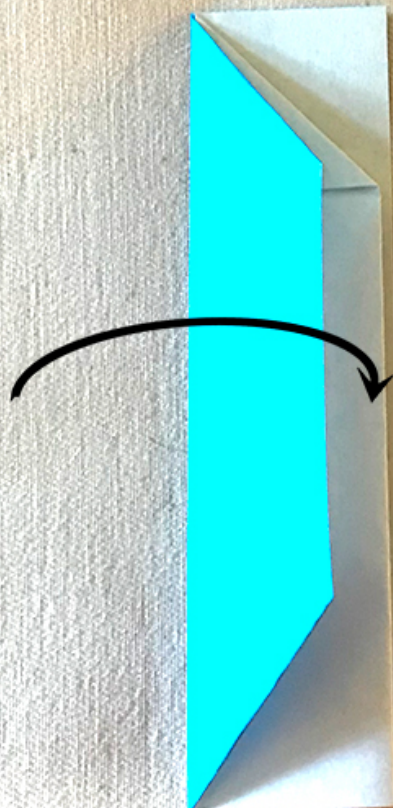
**2. Unfold, and bring top and bottom edges to meet the center fold;  
crease well**



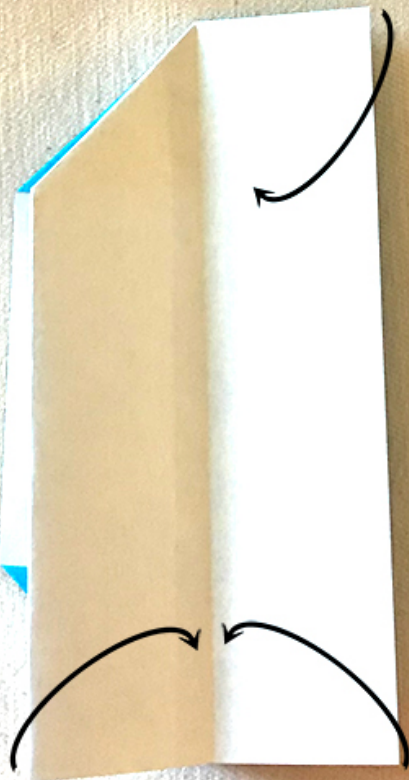
**3. Refold the center fold in the opposite direction so you end up with a little accordian, or two mountains and a valley**



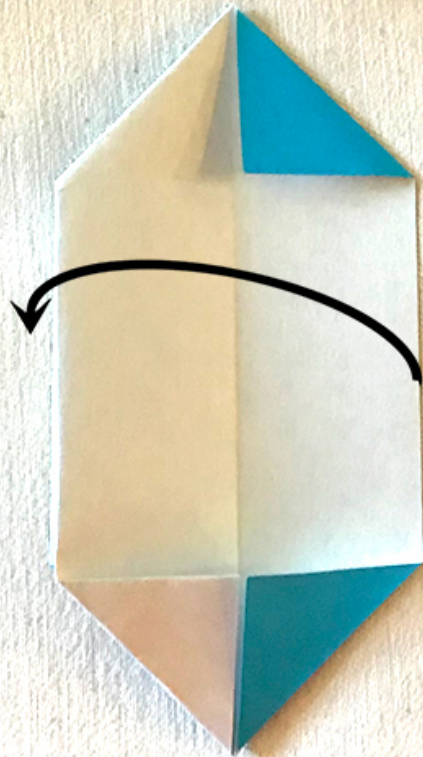
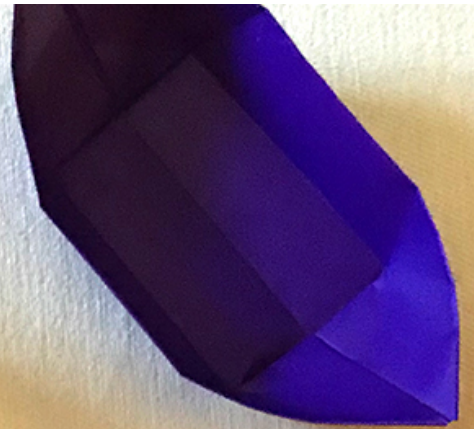
**4. Open one flap and fold the outside corners and one inside corner to the fold; leave the second layer underneath the inside corner where it is**



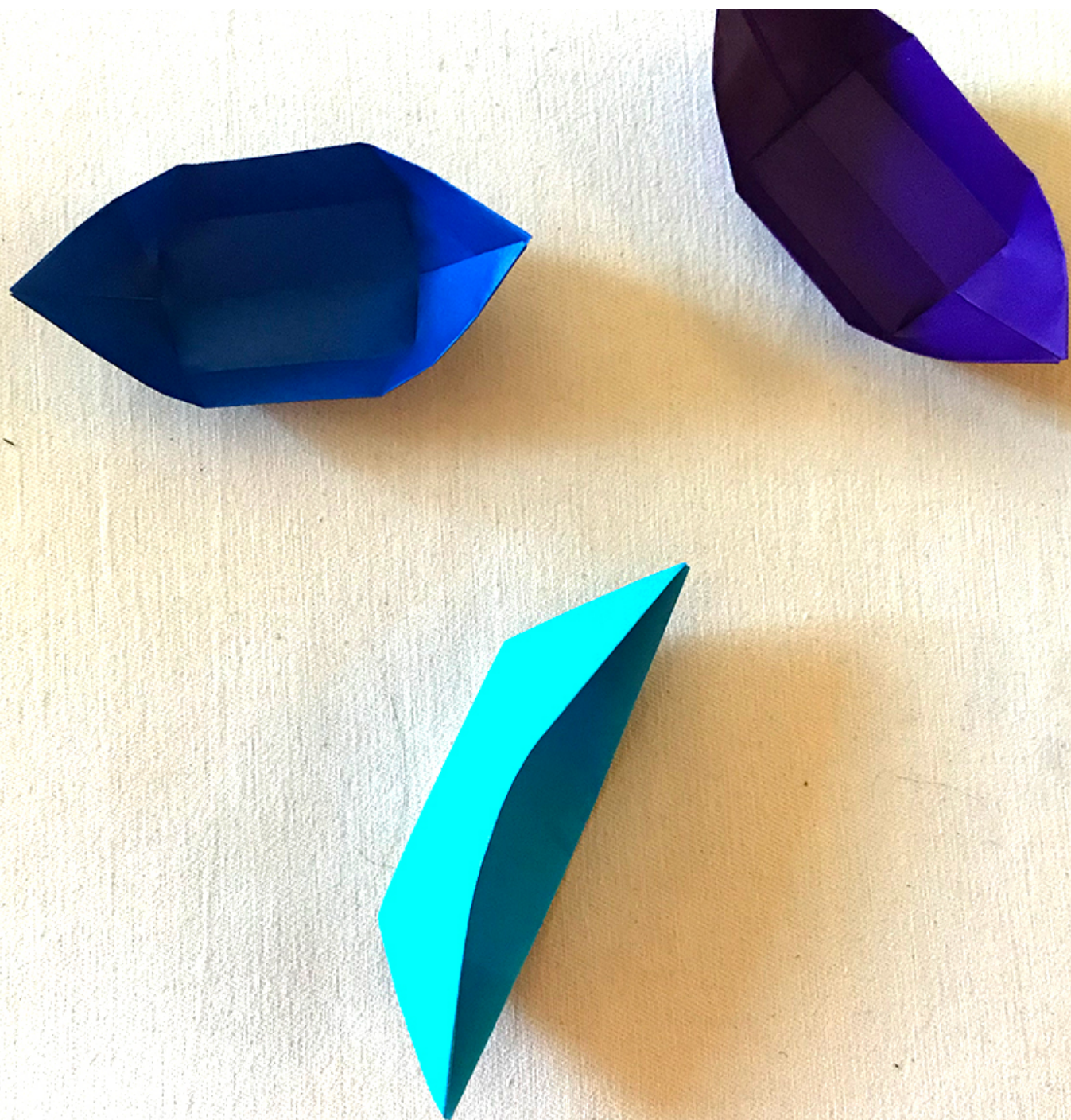
**5. Fold that flap back, and flip the whole thing over**



**6. Unfold second flap and repeat corner folds on the other side**

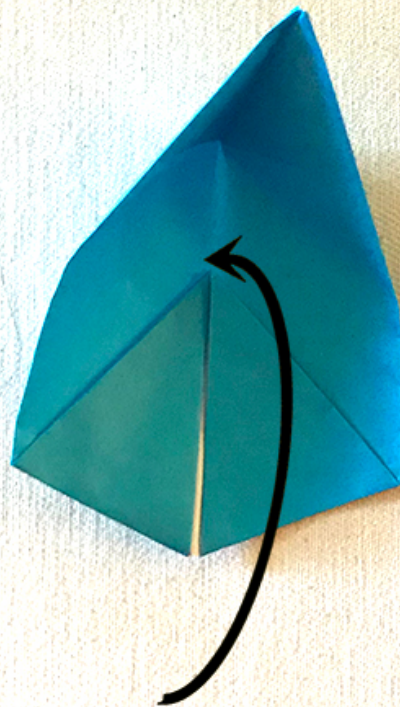


**7. Fold second flap back just like on the other side.  
Starting to look like a boat!**

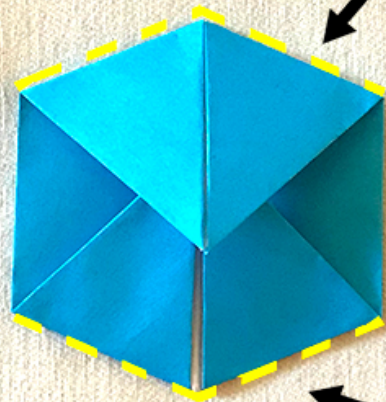


**8. Flip your boat over and open up along the fold**





**9. Fold the bow and stern (your boat's pointy ends) into the middle one at a time**



(this edge)



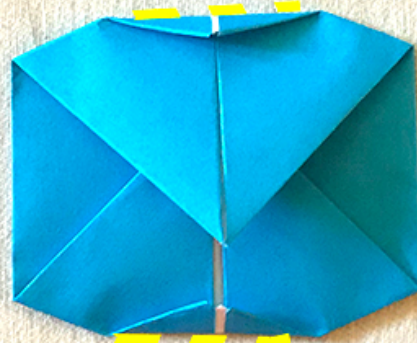

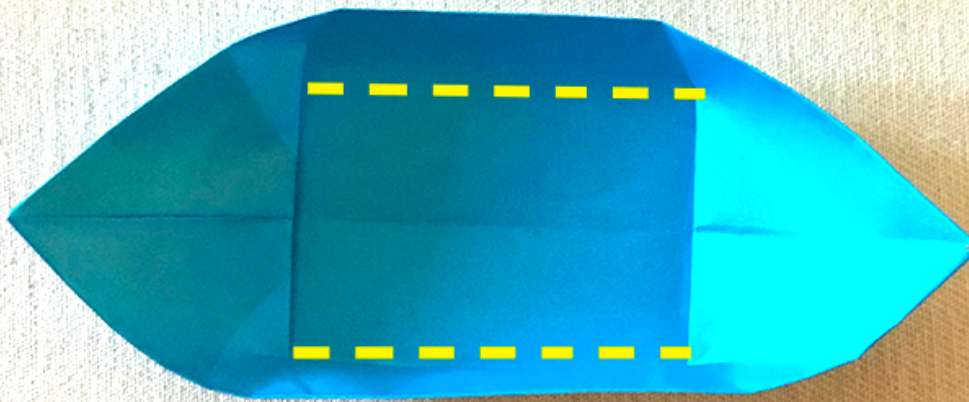
**10. Crease the edges well so the whole thing is pretty flat**



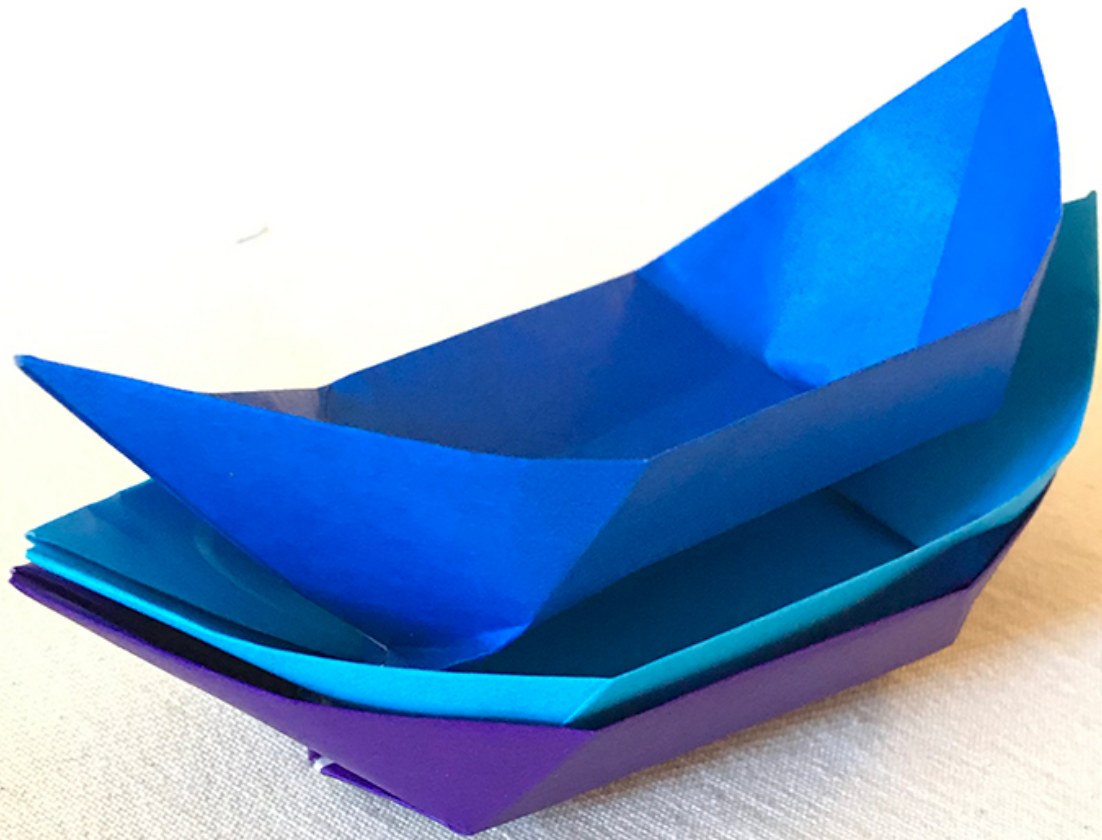
(doesn't matter exactly

**11. Fold these tiny edges up just a little bit**



**12. Open your bow and stern back up,  
and give a little crease along the dotted yellow lines  
(corner to corner of the last two teeny folds)**



**13. And stand back to admire your stackable dories!**
