Notes

- 1. This paper seeks to show by tables and plotted curves of contract prices.
 - a. Relative price of different vessels in seven classes built for the Navy: Battleships, Monitors, Armored Cruisers, Protected Cruisers, Gunboats, Torpedo Boats and Destroyers.
 - b. Relative prices between different firms in different parts of the country.
 - c. Relative prices of the different classes one to another.
 - d. The direction in which prices have been tending.
- 2. Because of the "great variety of species found in the torpedo boat branch" there is a scattering of data points.
- 3. Average torpedo boat prices decreased slightly over the period 1888-1896 (Extracted from Plates 115 & 116)
 - a. Average Price per ton decreased from \$900/ton to \$830/ton.
 - b. Average Price per ton-knot decreased from \$40/ton-knot to \$32/ton-knot.
- 4. There is a general consensus among the comments on the paper the data, although interesting, offered no significant conclusions.
- 5. The following torpedo boat table of TBs 1-18 data is extracted from Table 7, pg. 208.
